### **MORSELS & TIDBITS FROM OUR PASTOR**

The St. Francis of Assisi Community is a welcoming Christian family.

We believe in Jesus Christ and are guided by the Holy Spirit and the example of St. Francis.

We gather to celebrate, to grow in the knowledge of our faith rooted in the Catholic tradition, and to recognize our responsibility to reach out to the world.

### Gospel in everyday English

"I've loved you the way my Father has loved me. Make yourselves at home in my love. If you keep my commands, you'll remain intimately at home in my love. That's what I've done—kept my Father's commands and made myself at home in his love. "I've told you these things for a purpose: that my joy might be your joy, and your joy wholly mature. This is my command: Love one another the way I loved you. This is the very best way to love. Put your life on the line for your friends. You are my friends when you do the things I command you. I'm no longer calling you servants because servants don't understand what their master is thinking and planning. No, I've called you friends because I've let you in on everything I've heard from the Father. "You didn't choose me, remember; I chose you, and put you in the world to bear fruit, fruit that won't spoil. As fruit bearers, whatever you ask the Father in relation to me, he gives you. "But remember the root command: Love one another" (from John 15).

### Notes on the Scripture

The theme of love permeates the readings for the Sixth Sunday of Easter. From Jesus' command to his disciples in the Gospel reading to love one another to the Presbyter's definition of the essence of God in his first letter ("God is love"), the experience of love lies at the core of all that is divine. Today's Gospel reading is a continuation of Jesus' vine-and-branches discourse heard last Sunday. The vine-and-branches discourse is part of Jesus' larger farewell discourse to the disciples (John 13–17). Jesus makes the point that the "branches" (the disciples) remain connected to the "vine" (Jesus) by keeping Jesus' commandments. And Jesus tells the disciples, "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." It seems so easy, but is it really? Let's keep trying to live that way!!!!

### Mary Mother of God

May, in a special way, is dedicated to Mary, Mother of God. We try to honor her in different ways and through different prayers. Growing up, we used to gather as family and neighbors, to sing the Litany of Mary every day of May. Let us continue to praise God through Mary. (Our May Crowning is on May 13th as part of our morning Mass)

### First Eucharist

This weekend we are celebrating our 1<sup>st</sup> Communions and some of our second graders are approaching the table of the Eucharist for the very first time. As they experience God through the Eucharistic Meal I hope and pray that they can grow closer with Him and our church community. Congratulations!!!






